



## Foundation Issues Over \$80,000 in Grants During First Quarter

The Pickaway County Community Foundation began quarterly grant cycles in 2022. This change resulted in an opportunity for donors and grant applicants to have direct interaction through quarterly in-person grant presentations. As a result, PCCF presented \$81,000 in grants to local organization during the first quarter of this year.

Nonprofits submit their grant application to PCCF and are scheduled to present a 5-7 minute presentation about their specific grant. The foundation invited donors and interested community members to hear the presentations. Following the presentations, Grant Committees of different funds and individual donors evaluated the grants and decide whether to contribute to the grant recipient. Community members are invited to these presentations. The opportunity for donors to directly hear from the different organizations raises public awareness about the programs that these nonprofits offer. Among those included in the quarterly distribution of grants were the Simon Kenton Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Round Town As One, Haven House, Child Protection Center of Ross County, Pickaway County Community Action, Pickaway County Visitation Center, and local chapters of the Drug Free Clubs of America. The funded grants focus on trauma informed education, teaching life skills to youth, workforce initiatives, reduction in child abuse, and homelessness.
